*NINE TO NINETY*, a documentary film by director Alicia Dwyer and producer Juli Vizza, is not your average love story. But it is a story for our times.

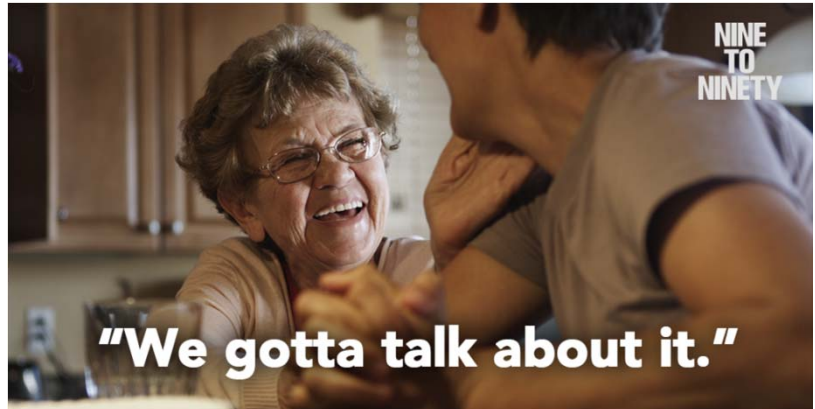
